LGBTQ seniors are often more at risk due to limited family support. Senior Rainbow Values Giving Back

On Saturday, October 26th, the Senior Rainbow executive team participated in National Make a Difference Day by volunteering with Rebuilding Together Metro Chicago in the Austin Neighborhood. The goal for the day was to help make senior citizen's homes safer so they can maintain their independence. Improvements and repairs included the installation of smoke alarms, carbon monoxide detectors, railings and grab bars. Volunteers also worked in the Vision on Menard Community Garden to prepare it for winter.

Rebuilding Together's Safe at Home program aims to make minor improvements to homes to help prevent falls, accidents and fire hazards, empowering older adults to live independently in their homes for years to come. We felt this program could be a model for our phase three program which is home repair. Volunteering helped us see a well-run program and we picked up a few home repair skills as well.
