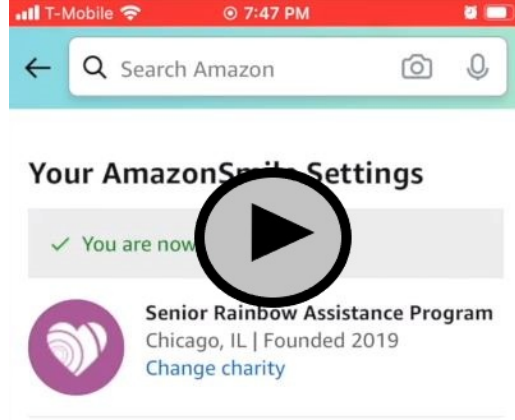

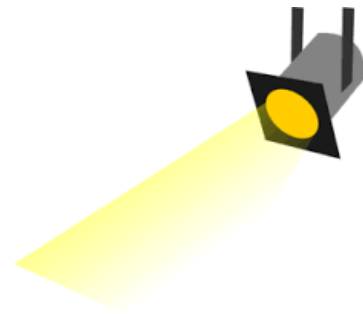

AgeOptions helps people thrive as they age. The nonprofit Area Agency on Aging of suburban Cook County since 1974, it connects older adults, people with disabilities and caregivers with resources and service options. AgeOptions plans, coordinates, funds and advocates for services and coordinates a network of community-based agencies to ensure effective and efficient service delivery.

With its network of partner agencies, AgeOptions is the principal source of information regarding older adult services in the 130 communities of suburban Cook County. In 2020, AgeOptions earned the Platinum (highest) credential from SAGECare, signifying the agency's commitment to providing culturally competent care to our LGBT+ elders, caregivers, and persons with disabilities.
